## Assignment Instructions for Writing your Two Case Study Reports:

First, open the other PDF file I have uploaded for you, titled "First Set", which contains all of the 3 reports I wrote on the child named Isha. The 3 reports on Isha contain the results and information from the 3 assessments which I conducted on her. The 3 assessments I did on Isha were the Developmental Indicators for the Assessment of Learning Fourth Edition (DIAL-4), The Developmental Assessment of Young Children Second Edition (DAYC-2), and the Bracken Basic Concept Scale Expressive (BBCS:E).

Then open the other PDF file titled "Second Set" I have uploaded for you which contains all of the 2 reports I wrote on the baby name Kaylee. The 2 reports on Isha contain the results and information from the 3 assessments which I conducted on her. The 3 assessments I did on Kaylee were the Vineland Adaptive Behavior Scales Third Edition (Vineland-3), the Ages & Stages Questionnaires Third Edition (ASQ-3), and the Ages & Stages Questionnaires Social-Emotional Second Edition (ASQ:SE-2).

For this major assignment, you have to write a main case and small case study report.

**Case Study Reports**: There are two case study report documents; the main case study consists of the three assessments given to Isha (the child in the age range of 4-5) and the smaller case study report consists of the three assessments given to Kaylee (the 1 year old baby . 20 points each for a total of 40 points

- For both the main and smaller case study you should include background information on the child, observations, caregiver interview, descriptions of the tests used (either 3 tests for the main case study report or 2 tests for the smaller case study report), content broken out by the developmental domains, and recommendations.
- You may get inspiration and ideas by googling "Transdisciplinary play-based assessment".
- You should have at least two strengths and two needs for each developmental domain as well as 2 next step recommendations, as well as a final summary section with additional, novel next step ideas summarized for each domain that are parent/family friendly.
- Since you will likely be assessing typical children, the needs you describe may simply be the next stage in the developmental sequence. These are reflected as next steps/recommendations to continue to address skill areas for growth.

In addition, I have uploaded another PDF file for you, titled "Example" which is an example of a case study done by someone else (except this person's case study was on different assessments). This example includes charts embedded within the domains. This is a good format to follow.

I have also uploaded another PDF file for you titled "Checklist" which is a checklist that will assist in guiding you as you develop the case study, this is the minimum requirements.
