Question

Please choose one of the following questions, and write a response of 5–6 pages.¹² We recommend you to write a paper with a well structured argument that is supported by course readings, lectures, and/or outside readings with proper citations.³ You have to turn in your final exam to Turnitin.com via TritonEd. We do not accept submissions through emails or physical copies.

- Explain the problem of moral markets.
- Explain the neo Confucian renovation.
- Explain the logic of East Asian law.
- Explain the five constant virtues with a particular emphasis on Ren.
- Explain self-cultivation and its political significance.
- Explain the overall significance of the family for human flourishing.
- Is Confucianism compatible with contemporary economic concepts? Explain.
- Is Confucianism liberal or conservative?

¹At least single-spaced, and at most double-spaced. That is, you should not set the line spacing to something like 0.7; neither should you set it to something like 2.5. The bottom line is that you need to demonstrate a keen understanding of the course materials. Playing with format in order to write less would probably decrease the probability that you can demonstrate your understanding of the materials.

²We have no preference for fonts, although Times New Roman, and 12 point font are *very strongly* recommended. Playing with format in order to write less would probably decrease the probability that you can demonstrate your understanding of the materials.

³If the quote is from a lecture, then you need to specify date of the lecture. If the quote is from a book, then you need to provide the page number. Outside resources are a plus *only when* you've demonstrated a keen understanding of the course materials already. Promiscuously citing a wide range of outside resources without demonstrating knowledge of the course materials is *strongly* advised against.

Late Policy

Assignments not received by Aug 3 at 1PM sharp will be marked down 5% *per day* automatically. That is, if you turn in your essay on Aug 3 at 1:01PM, then it's one day late and your grade will be marked down by 5% – an originally 90% paper would receive a grade of $90 \times (1 - 5\%) = 85.5\%$ instead. If you turn in your assignment at 1PM on Aug 4, then it's two days late, and penalty builds up exponentially – for example, an originally 90% paper would receive a grade of $90 \times (1 - 5\%)^2 = 81.2\%$ if it is turned in two days late. If you turn in your assignment at 1PM on Aug 5, then it's considered three days late, etc. The late penalty is incurred automatically, and we do *not* retroactively waive the penalty unless you obtain a letter from the Dean, physician, or academic advisor that documents the reason in detail. A receipt of Advil, picture of a keyed car, or selfie at an airport does *not* count as a sufficient reason. If you experience an Internet outage, then you need a letter from your service provider to verify that there is no service right around Aug 3 at 1PM. As the deadline is **very** strict, please plan accordingly, and submit your assignment before the due date.
