Annotated Bibliography



An annotated bibliography is a summary and/or evaluation of each source used for researching a topic.

Suggested structure for an annotated bibliography:

depends on the instructions

Citations formatted in the reference style required by the instructions

For example, a journal article cited as per MLA formatting requirements:

Duvall, John N. "The (Super)Marketplace of Images: Television as Unmediated Mediation in DeLillo's White Noise." *Arizona Quarterly*, vol. 50, no. 3, 1994, pp. 127-53.

Summary

- Define the purpose of the work
- O Name potential audience if applicable
- O State topics covered
- O Enumerate research methods if applicable
- Sum up the main conclusions/findings

Evaluation *

- Identify strengths and limitations
- Evaluate the credibility of the source
- O Measure contribution to the existing field of knowledge

Reflection *

O Determine the value/relevance of the source for your research

* - optional parts depend on the instructions
